INTRODUCTION:

Ravi Zacharias, a Christian apologist who speaks around the world, was asked which is more important love or truth, and he responded truth. The questioner quickly disagreed to state that love is the most important to which Ravi responded, "Is that true?"

This little conversation illustrates that love and truth go together but without truth, there can be no understanding of love or anything else in the world.

We see in our world today, and particularly in our society:

- ☆ confusion of identity,
- * the extinction of logic and reasoning,
- * the collapse of moral frameworks,
- ☆ Delusional ideologies,
- ☆ Political demagoguery (when a politician or political groups appeal to popular desires and prejudices rather than using rational argument) I've seen this in both Republicans & Democrats

These issues exist because we as a people, society, country and world have lost our appetite for truth. Feelings have become the barometer in which we measure values, and critical thinking has become an enemy to many and a past time for a few. Today, we are quick to believe lies, but slow to investigate truth, and gossip is a multi-million dollar business from magazines to news reports. Why is this the case? Because we have left no room for God in our society, our homes, and ultimately our hearts.

A. Definitions that matter:

- 1. **Reality** the state of things as they actually exist, as opposed to an idealistic or notional idea of them.
- 2. Truth/True in accordance with fact or reality.
- 3. Absolutes a value or principle regarded as universally valid or able to be viewed without relation to other things.
- 4. **Relativity** the absence of standards of absolute and universal application.
- 5. **Objective** not influenced by personal feelings or opinions in considering and representing facts.
- 6. **Subjective** based on or influenced by personal feelings, tastes, or opinions.

- A. The Main Question: Logically who should be the final authority of Reality?
 - B. The different philosophical "isms" are based on views of authority. Some examples would be:
 - 1. Atheism denial there is a divine final authority
 - a. *Hedonism* Pleasure is the final authority
 - b. *Humanism* Humans are the final authority
 - 2. **Theism** God is the final authority
 - a. *Christian Theism* belief that Jesus is the final authority
 - b. Islamic Theism belief Allah is the final authority
 - 3. Agnosticism No one knows the final authority
 - C. The question of who is the final authority determines a lot in recognizing and acknowledging what you believe to be true.
 - D. How do we determine what is true is based not on feelings but logic, and what is truth is the final authority.
