INTRODUCTION

'We really shouldn't look like a church.' I've heard that so much I want to vomit. 'Why?' I ask. 'Do you want your bank to look like a bank? Do you want your doctor's office to look like a doctor's office, or would you prefer your doctor to dress like a clown?'

Jesus told His followers that we are to be Salt and Light which are reflections of who He is in our world and desires to be through His followers. Let's look at our text this morning.

Matthew 5:13-16

"You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt should lose its taste, how can it be made salty? It's no longer good for anything but to be thrown out and trampled on by men.

"You are the light of the world. A city situated on a hill cannot be hidden. No one lights a lamp and puts it under a basket, but rather on a lampstand, and it gives light for all who are in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before men, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven.

Salt

Salt was a preservative for meat in the days before refrigeration. Christ through this metaphor is stating that the life of the Church is meant to preserve societies and cultures through its Image Bearing values. It was also meant as a spice, and as believers we should be the spice, that gives the world its flavor. We are not to use our saltiness to burn in the wounds of others who are hurting, but to preserve the life God gave them through healing. This is the repercussion of the Jesus life in any society if only Christians would live it.

Light

Light is used to illuminate paths that have been overtaken by darkness. Jesus called His followers to be lights in a dark world to illuminate the way to Him for those trap in darkness. We are not to use the light we have been given to burn people's eyes out in interrogation, but rather to lovingly show them the way out of darkness and pray they follow. This is the repercussion of the Jesus life in any society if only Christians would live it.
