Living the Life of Christ's Disciple

Mark 1:16-20, 2:13-17

INTRODUCTION:

This morning we are beginning a series on *Living the Life of Christ's Disciple: What should our lives look like?* We will over the next few weeks be discussing the different attributes of what it means to be a follower of Jesus.

Many today do not give much thought to what it means to follow Christ other than they have said some prayer in their past, and they feel assured of going to Heaven when they die. Our view of discipleship and what it means to follow Christ in the modern church tends to be on the very shallow side of Christ's recruitment policies according to Scripture, and the examples that have come before us down through Church history. We need to change this. Listen to what Paul writes when writing to the Corinthian church about the need for spiritual growth.

But I, brothers, could not address you as spiritual people, but as people of the flesh, as infants in Christ. ²I fed you with milk, not solid food, for you were not ready for it. And even now you are not yet ready, ³ for you are still of the flesh. For while there is jealousy and strife among you, are you not of the flesh and behaving only in a human way? ¹

The writer of Hebrews states,

Therefore, let us leave the elementary doctrine of Christ and go on to maturity, not laying again a foundation of repentance from dead works and of faith toward God, ² and of instruction about washings, the laying on of hands, the resurrection of the dead, and eternal judgment. ³ And this we will do if God permits.²

We must go on deeper into what it means to follow Christ, but we must first consider what it means to follow Him. So, let's turn our attention to a couple examples of Christ inviting His first followers to follow Him.

Mark 1:16-20

¹⁶ Passing alongside the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and Andrew the brother of Simon casting a net into the sea, for they were fishermen. ¹⁷ And Jesus said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you become fishers of men." ¹⁸ And immediately they left their nets and followed him. ¹⁹ And going on a little farther, he saw James the son of Zebedee and John his brother, who were in their boat mending the nets. ²⁰ And immediately he called them, and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired servants and followed him. ³

Mark 2:13-17

¹³ He went out again beside the sea, and all the crowd was coming to him, and he was teaching them. ¹⁴ And as he passed by, he saw Levi the son of Alphaeus sitting at the tax booth, and he said to him, "Follow me." And he rose and followed him. ¹⁵ as he reclined at table in his house, many tax collectors and sinners were reclining with Jesus and his disciples, for there were many who followed him. ¹⁶ And the scribes of the Pharisees, when they saw that he was eating with sinners and tax

collectors, said to his disciples, "Why does he eat with tax collectors and sinners?" ¹⁷ And when Jesus heard it, he said to them, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. I came not to call the righteous, but sinners." ⁴

I. Follow Jesus

day be raised. ²² And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him, saying, "Far be it from you, Lord! This shall never happen to you." ²³ But he turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are a hindrance to me. For you are not setting your mind on the things of God, but on the things of man.⁶

III. Faithfulness Out of Love

1 John 4:19-21

¹⁹We love because he first loved us. ²⁰ If anyone says, "I love God," and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen. ²¹ And this commandment we have from him: whoever loves God must also love his brother. ¹⁰

John 15:1-6

I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. ² Every branch in me that does not bear fruit he takes away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes, that it may bear more fruit. ³ Already you are clean because of the word that I have spoken to you. ⁴ Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. ⁵ I am the vine; you are the branches. 1 John 3:6

No one who abides in him keeps on sinning; no one who keeps on sinning has either seen him or known him¹³

V. Foundational Living on the Theology of God's Word

Contrary to the popular conception, theology is not an arcane science (only understood by a few) or academic compartment, like the other -ologies, whose field a scholar progressively masters by processing more and more information (or by earning higher degrees). To know *what is in Christ* takes much more than adding a few items to one's storehouse of knowledge. Yes, theology concerns the knowledge of God, but what it yields is not more data but greater understanding— of God, and of everything else in relation to God.¹⁵
